

New Diana ISD Parent and Family Engagement Plan 2023-2024

- Review your child's student records when needed. NDISD makes this information available to parents through our parent portal.

- Become a school volunteer. Application forms are posted on our district website.
- Participate in campus parent organizations.

NDISD Partnership with Family and Community

NDISD will:

- 1. involve parents or guardians of students in the joint development of the District Improvement Plan, School Improvement Plan, the Parent and Family Engagement Plan, and the school review and improvement process.
- 2. support Robert F Hunt Elementary, our Title I campus by providing coordination, technical assistance, and other necessary support to build schools' capacity and implement effective parent and family involvement activities to improve student academic achievement and school performance.
- 3. educate principals, teachers, and other staff in the value and utility of contributions of parents and guardians, how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents and guardians as equal partners, how to implement and coordinate parent and family programs, and how to build ties between parents, families, and the schools, ,with the assistance of parents and guardians,
- 4. ensure that information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to parents or guardians of participating students in a format and language.
